Perhaps the most inspiring part of Bethany House's 40th Anniversary Celebration was hearing the incredible story of Natasha, a courageous survivor who found refuge and support at Bethany House and has since transformed her life into something truly remarkable.

Natasha's journey at Bethany House started when she escaped an abusive relationship with her children's father. At Bethany House, she found safety, compassion, and the opportunity to start anew.

Natasha has always worked in the restaurant industry and had recently lost her job right before coming to Bethany House in 2020. She and her children stayed in a hotel during their time at Bethany House (as many families did during the pandemic), and luckily for Natasha, there was a kitchen area. She was able to perfect her cooking skills while in shelter, and this helped her to keep her mind at ease during a difficult time...as well as try out some new dishes!

She soon found a new job as a chef at Allyn's Café on Columbia Parkway. She still works there now three years later, bringing her new and unique flavors to the customers each week.

Natasha's journey reminds us of the importance of providing families with a safe space to heal and rediscover their passions. After 40 years, Bethany House remains committed to offering support, resources, and hope to individuals like Natasha who are seeking refuge and a fresh start.

On September 16th, Bethany House lost its longest-tenured employee and one of the community's most staunch advocates for families experiencing homelessness.

Gwendolyn Green, known affectionately by most as "Ms. Gwen," started at Bethany House in 1995. She held a number of different case manager positions before being named the Shelter Director in 2010. Ms. Gwen continued in this role until her recent passing.

Ms. Gwen's commitment to helping women and children was legendary. She was a teacher, listener, mentor, guide, and confidant for so many staff and clients. For her service and dedication, she was honored with the Greater Cincinnati Homeless Coalition's "Julie Martin Award" and Church Women United's "Vibrant Woman Award," among others.

Thinking about the great joy she felt about her work at Bethany House, Gwen reflected just a few months ago, "It's just the best when families get housing and move out, then come back to tell you how they're doing. We have a lot of women who come back years later to see us and show us how much their kids have grown."

Our community is a stronger place thanks to Ms. Gwen's compassion and dedication. Rest in peace and power, Ms. Gwen.





Music with Timmy

Timmy is a talented student from Seven Hills School who has been performing music on a weekly basis at Bethany House for nearly two months. The families, especially the children, adore him!

Timmy sings and play the guitar and can be found serenading families in our dining room during meals or performing with children during Kidz Zone. No matter where he is, he helps create a relaxing, calming, and fun atmosphere for families living in shelter.

He loves sharing his musical gifts with others, but what truly motivates Timmy is making people happy. Bethany House is so fortunate to have him as a part of the volunteer program. Thank you, Timmy!

New ESL Volunteer-Led Program

Bethany House embraces different cultures, celebrates diversity, and understands inclusion. It is essential that when a family walks through the doors, regardless of race, ethnicity, country of origin, or any other characteristic, they feel respected, loved, and cared for.

This includes having services available in your native language. Having people who can communicate with families in their first language—especially during times of crisis-is one way Bethany House can deepen its commitment to trauma-informed care. Though Bethany House uses the Language Line for non-English speakers, a noticeable uptick in Spanishspeaking families has spurred on a new development.

In October, Bethany House began hosting "Learn How to Speak Conversational Spanish" classes to all staff. Elizabeth Salinas Newby, a retired social worker and native of Mexico will be teaching the classes. She speaks Spanish fluently and certainly understands the culture and needs of the families that Bethany House serves. We are so excited about this new collaboration!
