### **A New Home and New Start**

Lakuvya and her son, Steven, became homelessness when her husband abruptly left. Lukuvya didn't work outside the home and had no way to cover the rent.

In a race against time, Lakuvya was referred to Bethany House through Project Connect, a Bethany House partner that works in Cincinnati Public Schools.

Bethany House acted swiftly, providing Lakuvya and Steven with immediate shelter and support. But their dog, Faith, could not come with them! However, thanks to Bethany House's partnership with Found House, Faith found a safe, temporary home.

During her stay at Bethany House, Lakuvya attended life skills courses and found solace in a community of women sharing similar experiences. These sessions became a platform for self-discovery and acceptance, empowering Lakuvya to embrace her identity and rebuild her confidence.

Through her resilience and the support she received, Lakuvya secured employment and permanent housing. In March, she and Steven joyfully moved into their new home-and reunited with Faith.

Lakuvya credits Bethany House for providing her with the chance to breathe, connect with others, and rebuild her life with renewed strength and gratitude.

## Planning for the Next Three Years

In December 2023, Bethany House's Board of Directors adopted a new Strategic Plan to guide the organization's direction and operations for the next three years. The three major pillars of this new plan are as follows:



## Grow Diverse Sustainable Resources

Bethany House will ensure organizational stability by retaining and developing a diverse workforce, growing revenue annually, and improving the organization's brand recognition regionally.



## Expand Safe Affordable Housing Options

Bethany House will further address the housing crisis by evaluating Bethany Homes (24-unit apartment building), scaling its housing program, and developing 50 new units of affordable housing.



### Achieve Long-Term Family Well-Being

Bethany House will address other barriers to long-term stability by enhancing workforce development, creating a transportation program, expanding mental health access, and exploring on-site childcare.

# New Partnership for Therapeutic Services





Bethany House has partnered with Butterfly Support Services to offer group therapeutic services for school-aged children four days a week, which started in December 2023.

Butterfly's expertise in emotional well-being and social skills complements Bethany House's mission. This partnership expands on-site mental health services and supports children's emotional well-being, healthy development, and coping skills

to navigate life's challenges effectively and build resilient futures for a brighter tomorrow.

## Homelessness at the Supreme Court

There is a case before the US Supreme Court—*Grants Pass v. Johnson*—that could dramatically impact people experiencing homelessness.

A ruling in favor of Grants Pass would allow cities to criminalize sleeping outside when shelters are full. Bethany House is strongly against any criminalization of homelessness, as this will exacerbate rather than alleviate cycles of poverty and marginalization.

In this case, the Supreme Court has the chance to affirm that the role of local government is to make room for everyone, not just some.
